1583	Abbeville, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Abbeville proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for water and sewer improvements in the Cannonville Drive/Cannonville Road and Easy Street areas of Abbeville. The project will benefit 155 persons, of whom 150 (97%) are LMI. The project will include replacement of vitrified clay gravity sewer main with 8-inch PVC sewer main, installation of new 8-inch PVC main to replace failing septic tanks, new manholes, and replacement of inadequate water mains with new 6-inch PVC water main. Total project cost is \$563,979, with \$63,979 in match and leverage.
1611	Adairsville, City of Boys and Girls Club	\$500,000	The City of Adairsville, in partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of Bartow County, proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for a new building to house the Boys and Girls Club. The project will benefit 118 persons, of whom 92 (78%) are LMI. The project includes construction of a new 4,500 square-foot building on a 2.35-acre tract of land which allows adequate space and room for future expansion needs. This building will replace a current facility which is outdated and inadequate in size and facilities. Total project cost is \$967,855 with \$467,855 in match and leverage.
1620	Alapaha, City of Sewer Improvements	\$392,340	The City of Alapaha proposes using \$392,340 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements in the target area including Church, Pait, Shockley, Moore, Williams, and Charles Streets. The project will benefit 100 persons, of whom 71 (71%) are LMI. The project will include rehabilitation of aging, inadequate sewer lines with the Cured-in-Place (CIP) trenchless procedure, rehabilitation of manholes, replacement of smaller sections with new sewer line, and replacement of existing service connections. Total project cost is \$445,282, with \$52,942 in match and leverage.
1616	Arlington, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Arlington proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements in two target areas - Kelly Lane, Bradford Lane, and Wood Valley Road on the west side of Arlington, and Harpe Road and Lovett Lane on the outskirts of Arlington. The project will benefit 84 persons, of whom 80 (95%) are LMI. The project will include installation of a sewage collection system (sewer main, manholes, pump stations, service connections, etc.) to connect 25 residences with inadequate septic tanks to the public sewer. Total project cost is \$692,584, with \$192,584 in match and leverage.
1567	Ashburn, City of Water Improvements	\$226,205	The City of Ashburn proposes to use \$226,205 in CDBG funds to provide water improvements along Taylor Street in the West Ashburn Neighborhood. The project will benefit 116 persons, of whom 107 (92%) are LMI. The project will replace undersized water lines with new six-inch mains and will include new service laterals and backflow prevention devices for all households, seven new fire hydrants, and isolation valves. Total project cost is \$268,401, with \$42,196 in match and leverage funds.

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1646	Atkinson County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$495,536	Atkinson County proposes using \$495,536 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements in the Morning Dew Circle area. The project will benefit 70 persons, of whom 63 (90%) are LMI. The project includes construction of a new drainage system (raised edge gutter, stormwater catch basins, storm drain pipes, etc.) and new pavement for a dirt road. Total project cost is \$560,536, with \$65,000 in match and leverage.
1564	Baldwin County Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Baldwin County proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide sewer improvements in the Richard Drive Target Area. The project will benefit 98 persons, of whom 80 (82%) are LMI. The project will replace existing sewer lines with Cured In Place Pipe (CIPP) line. New sewer service laterals will be extended to each target area home. All manholes will be replaced, and cleanouts will be installed. Total project cost is \$634,882, with \$134,882 in match and leverage funds and in-kind services.
1557	Banks County Senior Center	\$500,000	Banks County proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to expand and renovate the existing Senior Center located at 700 Thompson Street in Homer. The project will benefit 261 persons, of whom 261 (100%) are LMI. Repairs will be made to roofing, window seals, gutters, flooring, and HVAC. The building also will be expanded with a new craft room, fitness center, activity area, ADA restrooms, and storage. Total project cost is \$874,555, with \$374,555 in match and leverage funds.
1639	Ben Hill County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Ben Hill County proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements in the Ashton Way and St. John's Road Target Areas. The project will benefit 88 persons, of whom 79 (90%) are LMI. The project includes, for both target areas, paving on existing dirt roads as well as a stormwater collection system (driveway culverts, cross drain culverts, and concrete flared end sections). Total project cost is \$585,825, with \$85,825 in match and leverage.
1654	Berrien County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$228,858	Berrien County proposes to use \$228,858 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements along King Road and Benefield Lane. The project will benefit 37 persons, of whom 31 (84%) are LMI. The project includes installation of soil cement base and Superpave asphalt over both dirt roads as well as rural roadside drainage improvements (network of ditches, driveway pipes, drainage pipes, etc.). Total project cost is \$356,379, with \$127,521 in match and leverage.
1581	Blakely, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Blakely proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements along Day, Love, and Jesse Johnson Streets. The project will benefit 230 persons, of whom 230 (100%) are LMI. The project includes replacement and rehabilitation (with cured-in-place piping) of inadequate sewer mains and manholes. Total project cost is \$685,000, with \$185,000 in match and leverage funds.

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1659	Blue Ridge, City of Water Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Blue Ridge proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for water improvements in the Orchard Boulevard Neighborhood. The project will benefit 160 persons, of whom 133 (83%) are LMI. The project includes looping deadend water lines, installation of new six-inch PVC water main, fire hydrants, valves, meters, and service connections, and repair of roads and driveways disturbed by proposed water improvements. Total project cost is \$650,330, with \$150,330 in match and leverage.
1575	Boston, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Boston proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide street and drainage improvements to the Southeast Boston Neighborhood. The project will benefit 124 persons, of whom 113 (91%) are LMI. The project will include rehabilitation and replacement of inadequate culverts and cross drains as well as installation of curb and gutter, a storm drainage pipe, and asphalt overlay to streets impacted by drainage improvements. Total project cost is \$589,000, with match and leverage funds of \$89,000.
1613	Bronwood, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Bronwood proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements in the target area which includes Park Avenue, Roberts Drive, Scott Alley, Fourth, Amy, Johnson, and Church Streets. The project will benefit 59 persons, of whom 59 (100%) are LMI. The project includes construction of a storm drainage collection system, including piping network with drainage structures, curb and gutter, and asphalt overlay of existing roads. Total project cost is \$560,290, with \$60,290 in match and leverage.
1588	Buena Vista, City of Recreational Facility	\$498,007	The City of Buena Vista proposes to use \$498,007 in CDBG funds for public facility improvements to the Josh Gibson Center Gymnasium. The project will benefit 165 persons, of whom 151 (92%) are LMI. The project includes a new roof, ADA upgrades, pest removal, and new finishes as well as plumbing, mechanical and electrical repairs. Total project cost is \$519,007, with \$21,000 in match and leverage.
1587	Butler, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Butler proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements in the target area which includes Martin Luther King Blvd., Georgia Road, Whitening Road, and Mason Lane. The project will benefit 55 persons, of whom 46 (84%) are LMI. The project includes construction of new eight-inch sewer gravity main and service laterals, new manholes, manhole rehabilitation, rerouting of sewer lines under residences, and related activities. Total project cost is \$539,786, with \$39,786 in match and leverage.
1577	Cairo, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Cairo proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide street and drainage improvements to the Fifteenth Street Neighborhood. The project will benefit 85 persons, of whom 85 (100%) are LMI. The project will include replacement of undersized culverts, new curb and gutter on each project area street, curb inlets, and street widening. Total project cost is \$582,121, with \$82,121 in match and leverage funds.

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1645	Calhoun County Health Center	\$500,000	Calhoun County proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for construction of a new Public Health Department building. The project will benefit 1,749 persons, of whom 827 (47%) are LMI. The project includes construction of a new 3,278 square-foot building, which will replace the existing facility which does not comply with current compliance codes, safety requirements, or ADA. Total project cost is \$561,688, with \$61,688 in match and leverage.
1558	Calhoun, City of Multi Activity Program	\$743,250	The City of Calhoun proposes, in partnership with the Calhoun Housing Authority (CHA), to use \$743,250 in CDBG funds to provide infrastructure and public housing improvements in the Cologa Homes public housing community. The project will replace obsolete water and sewer lines and install a new fire hydrant and trunk line, benefitting 112 persons, of whom 100% are LMI. Additionally, CDBG would help fund rehabilitation of 11 public housing units, benefitting 21 persons, 100% of whom are LMI. Total project cost is \$896,203, with \$152,953 in match and leverage funds.
1568	Camilla, City of Water Improvements	\$494,401	The City of Camilla proposes to use \$494,401 in CDBG funds to provide water improvements in the North Central Camilla Neighborhood. The project will benefit 169 persons, of whom 159 (94%) are LMI. The project will replace existing ductile iron, asbestos, and undersized lines with six-inch PVC mains and will include new household connections, hydrants, and valves. Total project cost is \$554,101, with \$59,700 in match and leverage funds.
1559	Cartersville, City of Water Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Cartersville proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide water system improvements in Phase I of the ATCO Mill Village Target Area. The project will serve 88 homes and will benefit 291 persons, of whom 249 (86%) are LMI. The project will replace existing water supply lines with new 8-inch ductile iron pipes, replace all household service lines, and replace water meter boxes. The total project cost is \$938,832, with \$438,832 in match and leverage funds.
1641	Clinch County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Clinch County proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements in the Moonshadow Road Target Area. The project will benefit 87 persons, of whom 72 (83%) are LMI. The project includes construction of earthen ditches and road pavement as well as installation of driveway pipes, ditch sections, and cross drains. Total project cost is \$544,050, with \$44,050 in match and leverage.

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1573	Cochran, City of Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Cochran proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide water, sewer, street, and drainage improvements in the Southwest Railroad Avenue Neighborhood. The project will benefit 87 persons, of whom 86 (99%) are LMI. The project will include repaving/reconstruction of neighborhood streets, curb and gutter, and cross drains. Undersized and asbestos cement lines will be replaced with new six-inch and four-inch water lines; the existing sewer system will be rehabilitated with Cured In Place Pipe (CIPP) or slip lining, a new sewer main, and a sealant process for existing manholes. Total project cost is \$693,630, with \$193,630 in match and leverage funds.
1648	Coffee County Neighborhood Revitalization	\$500,000	Coffee County proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for housing rehabilitation and reconstruction in the Oak Park Neighborhood. The project will benefit 22 persons, of whom 22 (100%) are LMI. The project includes rehabilitation of seven owner-occupied units and reconstruction of five owner-occupied units. Total project cost is \$526,596, with \$26,596 in match and leverage.
1638	Colbert, City of Water Improvements	\$497,000	The City of Colbert proposes using \$497,000 in CDBG funds for water improvements in two target areas - seven streets north of S.R. 72, and 5th Street, 5th Avenue and 8th Avenue south of S.R. 72. The project will benefit 122 persons, of whom 93 (76%) are LMI. The project includes installation of PVC water main, new fire hydrants, gate valves, and related items. Total project cost is \$522,070, with \$25,070 in match and leverage.
1653	Cook County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Cook County proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for streets and flood & drainage improvements along Oak Trace Road and River Trace Road. The project will benefit 108 persons, of whom 101 (94%) are LMI. The project includes road paving (subgrade and soil cement base with asphalt layer) and a system of ditch sections and cross drains. Total project cost is \$562,796, with \$62,796 in match and leverage.
1594	Cordele, City of Drainage Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Cordele proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for flood and drainage improvements in the historic Gillespie Selden Neighborhood, a designated Revitalization Strategy Area (RAS). The project will benefit 168 persons, of whom 166 (99%) are LMI. The project includes piping, re-grading, storm sewer inlets, and junction boxes. Total project cost is \$552,000, with \$52,000 in match and leverage.

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1665	Covington, City of Drainage Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Covington proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for drainage improvements along Alcovy Road. The project will benefit 497 persons, of whom 497 (100%) are LMI. The project includes construction of an open channel and replacement of aging pipes. Total project cost is \$1,207,582, with \$707,582 in match and leverage.
1569	Donalsonville, City of Water Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Donalsonville proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide water improvements in the southwest section of Donalsonville. The project will benefit 340 persons, of whom 244 (72%) are LMI. The project will replace undersized (two-inch) and asbestos cement water lines with new six-inch PVC mains and will include new service laterals for household connections, backflow prevention devices, 11 new fire hydrants, and isolation valves. Total project cost is \$569,000, with \$69,000 in match and leverage funds.
1658	Dublin, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Dublin proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements in south central Dublin (Roberts, Marcus, Kingsby, Hamilton, and Mitchell Streets). The project will benefit 161 persons, of whom 149 (93%) are LMI. The project includes the following: construction of curb and gutter; installation of a storm drainage system composed of curb inlets, cross-drains and piping; and road paving. Total project cost is \$826,587, with \$326,587 in match and leverage.
1636	East Dublin, City of Sewer Improvements	\$303,683	The City of East Dublin proposes using \$303,683 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements along GA HWY 26, Carrol Drive, Branham Street, and Railroad Avenue. The project will benefit 54 persons, of whom 52 (96%) are LMI. The project includes installation of eight-inch gravity sewer main to connect residents with inadequate septic tanks to the public sewer system. Total project cost is \$375,752, with \$72,069 in match and leverage.
1661	Eatonton, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Eatonton proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements along Church Street. The project will benefit 104 persons, of whom 104 (100%) are LMI. The project includes street paving as well as construction of curb and gutter and a storm drainage system composed of curb inlets, cross-drains, and piping. Total project cost is \$693,405, with \$193,405 in match and leverage.
1649	Ellenton, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Ellenton proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements in the northeast area of Ellenton (Peachtree, Cleveland, and Colquitt Streets and Central and Berrien Avenues). The project will benefit 75 persons, of whom 70 (93%) are LMI. The project includes road base improvements, asphalt leveling and resurfacing, and construction of curb and gutter. Total project cost is \$610,976, with \$110,976 in match and leverage.

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1660	Emanuel County Youth Center	\$500,000	Emanuel County proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for rehabilitation of the Gumlog Gymnasium to be used by the Community Action for Youth organization. The project will benefit 568 persons, of whom 447 (79%) are LMI. The project includes exterior renovations (window and door replacement, roof re-coating, brick and concrete sealant) and interior renovations (HVAC, electrical, restrooms, floor repair, fire alarm system, etc.). Total project cost is \$789,500, with \$289,500 in match and leverage.
1579	Floyd County Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Floyd County proposes to use \$800,000 in CDBG funds for multi-activity improvements in the historic North Mill Village area in the Lindale Community, which will be Phase I of a comprehensive neighborhood revitalization program. The project will benefit 134 persons, of whom 123 (92%) are LMI. The project includes acquisition and demolition of dilapidated houses, street/sidewalk improvements, homebuyer assistance, housing rehabilitation, and code enforcement. Total project cost is \$1,459,512, with \$659,512 in match and leverage.
1628	Folkston, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$362,034	The City of Folkston proposes using \$362,034 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements along Union Street and Paxton Road. The project will benefit 63 persons, of whom 59 (94%) are LMI. The project includes street paving, curb and gutter, and ditch and swale construction along Union Street as well as roadside ditch improvements and installation of concrete drainage pipes along Paxton Road. Total project cost is \$405,184, with \$43,150 in match and leverage.
1640	Funston, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Funston proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for street and flood & drainage improvements in the target area which includes South Manning, Daniel, Foy, and Peachtree Streets and Peachtree Circle. The project will benefit 62 persons, of whom 59 (95%) are LMI. The project includes curb and gutter, drainage structures, and sidewalks as well as driveway repair in areas of proposed drainage improvements. Total project cost is \$615,399, with \$115,399 in match and leverage.
1652	Geneva, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$500,000	The City of Geneva proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for neighborhood revitalization improvements along Tazwell Hwy, Columbus Hwy, Jenkins Lane, and Pine Circle. The project will benefit 32 persons, of whom 32 (100%) are LMI. The project includes clearance of three dilapidated housing units, rehabilitation of six housing units, and reconstruction of six housing units. Total project cost is \$514,526, with \$14,526 in match and leverage.
1624	Gray, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$500,000	The City of Gray proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for neighborhood revitalization along Martin Luther King Blvd. and Cleveland Avenue. The project will benefit 30 persons, of whom 21 (70%) are LMI. The project includes clearance of two dilapidated structures, rehabilitation of seven owner-occupied housing units, and reconstruction of three owner-occupied housing units. Total project cost is \$549,014, with \$49,014 in match and leverage.

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1615	Greenville, City of Water Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Greenville proposes using \$500,000 in CDBG funds for water improvements in the Baptist Hill Neighborhood. The project will benefit 239 persons, of whom 212 (89%) are LMI. The project will include new water mains to replace aging, undersized mains as well as new meters, valves, and fire hydrants. Total project cost is \$527,500, with \$27,500 in match and leverage.
1562	Griffin, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Griffin proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide water improvements in the Meriwether Phase I Target Area. The project will benefit 122 persons, of whom 114 (93%) are LMI. The project will replace small diameter galvanized steel piping with 6-inch ductile iron pipe water mains, replace water services to individual lots, and add additional fire hydrants to the target area. Total project cost is \$846,783, with \$346,783 in match and leverage funds.
1605	Hancock County Health Center	\$500,000	Hancock County proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for rehabilitation of the Hancock County Health Department building, located at 516 Boland Street. The project will benefit 621 persons, of whom 600 (97%) are LMI. The project includes exterior improvements (new siding, roof replacement, window and door replacement, handicap access ramp, retaining wall) and interior improvements (new HVAC, enhancements to building layout, handicap accessible restrooms, etc.). Total project cost is \$511,500, with \$11,500 in match and leverage.
1599	Hawkinsville, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Hawkinsville proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements along N. Dooley, N. Lumpkin, Dozier, and Harris Streets and Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. The project will benefit 126 persons, of whom 116 (92%) are LMI. The project will include pipe-bursting sewer mains, televising existing sewer pipes, raising and repairing manholes, rebuilding inverts, and service connections. Total project cost is \$510,000, with \$10,000 in match and leverage.
1650	Hazlehurst, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Hazlehurst proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements along MLK, Hazle, Brooker, Girtman, Young, Burney, and Mildred Streets. The project will benefit 205 persons, of whom 195 (95%) are LMI. The project includes rehabilitation of the existing sewer main with cured-in-place (CIP) lining, rehabilitation of existing manholes, and new service laterals. Total project cost is \$805,635, with \$305,635 in match and leverage.

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1560	Jackson, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Jackson proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide sewer improvements in the McKibben Street Target Area. The project will benefit 102 persons, of whom 100 (98%) are LMI. The project will replace sanitary sewer lines and household connections with 8-inch PVC pipe, replace 13 sanitary sewer manholes, and construct three new manholes. Total project cost is \$951,560, with match and leverage funds of \$451,560.
1635	Jacksonville, City of Water Improvements	\$396,219	The City of Jacksonville proposes to use \$396,219 in CDBG funds for city-wide water improvements. The project will benefit 145 persons, of whom 105 (72%) are LMI. The project includes abatement to the interior and exterior of the water tank (to address lead-based paint hazards), new water lines, and an isolation valve. Total project cost is \$436,719, with \$40,500 in match and leverage.
1600	Jeffersonville, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$299,100	The City of Jeffersonville proposes to use \$299,100 in CDBG funds for city-wide water and sewer improvements. The project will benefit 932 persons, of whom 682 (73%) are LMI. The project includes installation of new six-inch water mains and fire hydrants, repairs to existing water main, repairs to a city water well, and replacement of a sewer lift station. Total project cost is \$299,100, with no match and leverage.
1637	Johnson County Senior Center	\$500,000	Johnson County proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for rehabilitation of the County's Senior Center, located at 108 Hilton Holton Street. The project will benefit 39 persons, of whom 39 (100%) are LMI. The project includes exterior repairs, insulation, plumbing, roofing, interior finishes, and a 2,000 square-foot addition. Total project cost is \$596,000, with \$96,000 in match and leverage.
1621	Kingsland, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Kingsland proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements near S. Orange Edwards Blvd. in the central-north portion of Kingsland. The project will benefit 425 persons, of whom 380 (89%) are LMI. The project includes rehabilitation of existing sewer mains through pipebursting and cured-in-place (CIP) methods, rehabilitation of existing sewer pumps to submersible pumps, rehabilitation of manholes, and related activities. Total project cost is \$1,009,075, with \$509,075 in match and leverage.
1612	LaGrange, City of Youth Center	\$500,000	The City of LaGrange proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for rehabilitation of the Cannon Street School building, which houses several youth service agencies. The project will benefit 640 persons, of whom 580 (91%) are LMI. The project includes improvements to the kitchen and game room, security enhancements, HVAC, roofing, and more. Total project cost is \$581,000, with \$81,000 in match and leverage.

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1625	Lake Park, City of Water Improvements	\$338,402	The City of Lake Park proposes to use \$338,402 in CDBG funds for water improvements in a target area that includes South Main Street, Lane Drive, Toms Pond Road, East Cotton Avenue, and N. Railroad Avenue. The project benefits 111 persons, of whom 97 (87%) are LMI. The project includes new eight-inch water mains (to replace existing undersized mains), gate valves, and fire hydrants. Total project cost is \$513,139, with \$174,737 in match and leverage.
1622	Lakeland, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Lakeland proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements in the southeast area of Lakeland bordered by Patten Ave. and Jackson, Davis, 10th, and Oak Streets. The project will benefit 176 persons, of whom 134 (76%) are LMI. The project includes: replacement of the existing sewer system with new eight-inch sanitary sewer main, connections, and service transfers; construction and rehabilitation of manholes; and, rehabilitation of sanitary sewer line with pipebursting. Total project cost is \$615,002, with \$115,002 in match and leverage.
