Solid Waste Short Term Work Program Update Adoption

WHEREAS, the Georgia Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Act of 1990 requires all local governments to prepare Short Term Work Program Updates to their Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Marys has participated with Camden County and the Cities of Kingsland and Woodbine in a coordinated and comprehensive Short Term Work Program Update; and

WHEREAS, the Camden County Solid Waste Short Term Work Program Update has been submitted for formal review, comment, and recommendation to the Coastal Georgia Regional Development Center and the Georgia Department of Community Affairs as mandated by the Georgia Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Act of 1990; and

WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Short Term Work Program was certified by those review agencies as being in compliance with the Minimum Planning Standards and Procedures for Solid Waste Management; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Marys is now desirous of adopting the Solid Waste Short Term Work Program Update;



WHEREAS, after careful consideration, the Board of Commissioners of Camden County (the "Board of Commissioners"), the governing authority of Camden County (the "County") has determined that there is a need for a solid waste management authority to function in the County for the purposes and with all of the powers set forth in the Act, as the same now exists and as it may be hereafter amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of Camden County in public meeting assembled as follows:

1. There is a need for a solid waste management authority to exist, function, and to operate in and for the County, and there is hereby created, activated, and organized such an authority to be known as the Solid Waste Management Authority of Camden County (the "Authority"), to be governed in accordance with the Regional Solid Waste Management Authorities Act as the same now exists or may be hereafter amended.

2. The Authority shall consist of a board of five directors who shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Commissioners for a term of four years, or until their successors are duly and lawfully appointed.
