**SECOND
CLAYTON COUNTY SERVICE DELIVERY STRATEGY**

This Agreement to extend the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy is made this 1 day of May, 2006, by and between Clayton County, Georgia, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia (the "County"), the Cities of College Park, Forest Park, Jonesboro, Lake City, Lovejoy, Morrow and Riverdale (the "Cities"), and the Clayton County Water Authority, a body politic, created under the laws of the State of Georgia (the "Water Authority"). The parties collectively are hereinafter referred to as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties entered into the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy providing for the reorganization, and in some instances, the consolidation of local government service delivery programs in Clayton County; and

WHEREAS, the Parties previously agreed to extend the operation of the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy within Clayton County through April 28, 2006; and


WHEREAS, the Parties deem it in their respective best interests and the citizens of Clayton County will best be served by entering into a Second Service Delivery Strategy for the purposes state herein under the same terms and conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and the mutual undertakings by the respective Parties, it is agreed by and between the County, the Cities, and the Water Authority as follows:



- an updated service area map depicting the agreed upon service area for each provider if there is more than one service provider for each service that has been revised/updated within the county, and if the agreed upon service areas do not coincide with local political boundaries.

Each of our governing bodies (County Commission and City Councils) that are a party to this strategy have adopted resolutions agreeing to the Service Delivery arrangements identified in our strategy and have executed agreements for implementation of our service delivery strategy (O.C.G.A. 36-70-21);
3. Our service delivery strategy continues to promote the delivery of local government services in the most efficient, effective, and responsive manner for all residents, individuals and property owners throughout the county (O.C.G.A. 36-70-24(1));
4. Our service delivery strategy continues to provide that water or sewer fees charged to customers located outside the geographic boundaries of a service provider are reasonable and are not arbitrarily higher than the fees charged to customers located within the geographic boundaries of the service provider (O.C.G.A. 36-70-24 (2));
5. Our service delivery strategy continues to ensure that the cost of any services the county government provides (including those jointly funded by the county and one or more municipalities) primarily for the benefit of the unincorporated area of the county are borne by the unincorporated area residents, individuals, and property owners who receive such service (O.C.G.A. 36-70-24 (3));

6. Our Service Delivery Strategy continues to ensure that the officially adopted County and City land use plans of all local governments located in the County are compatible and nonconflicting (O.C.G.A. 36-70-24 (4)(A));

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CLAYTON COUNTY TO ENTER INTO THE RENEWAL AND RE-ADOPTION OF THE EXISTING SERVICE DELIVERY STRATEGY WITH THE CITIES OF COLLEGE PARK, FOREST PARK, JONESBORO, LAKE CITY, MORROW, LOVEJOY, RIVERDALE AND THE CLAYTON COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY PROVIDING FOR THE REORGANIZATION, AND IN SOME INSTANCES, THE CONSOLIDATION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE DELIVERY PROGRAMS IN CLAYTON COUNTY; TO AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT AND OTHERWISE PERFORM ALL ACTS NECESSARY TO ACCOMPLISH THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS RESOLUTION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the County entered into the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy with the Cities of College Park, Forest Park, Jonesboro, Lake City, Lovejoy, Morrow, Riverdale (the "Cities"), and the Clayton County Water Authority (the "Water Authority"), providing for the reorganization, and in some instances the consolidation of local government service delivery programs in Clayton County; and

WHEREAS, such parties previously agreed to extend the operation of the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy within Clayton County through April 28, 2003; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to further extend the operation of the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy, and Clayton County deems it in its best interest to enter into a Renewed Service Delivery Strategy for the stated purposes.

WHEREAS, the Clayton County Board of Commissioners, the Cities, and the Clayton County Water Authority previously prepared a written Service Delivery Strategy and executed an Intergovernmental Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties to the intergovernmental agreement have revised and determined

that they should re-adopt the same Service Delivery Agreement to be effective until April 29, 2011, unless the parties agree to review and amend same.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
OF CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED


Section 1. The Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the re-adoption of the previously adopted Service Delivery Strategy. The Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes Clayton County to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement for the Renewal and Re-adoption of the existing Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy with the Cities of College Park, Forest Park, Jonesboro, Lake City, Morrow, Lovejoy, Riverdale, and the Water Authority providing for the reorganization, and in some instances, the consolidation of local government service delivery programs in Clayton County. Further, the Board of Commissioners authorizes the Chairman to execute the Agreement and otherwise perform all acts necessary to accomplish the intent of this Resolution. The Agreement shall be in substantially the form attached hereto, subject to such minor changes, insertions or deletions as the Chairman may approve.

Section 2. The effective date of this Resolution shall be when approved by the Board of Commissioners of Clayton County.



WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Lake City, Georgia have reviewed the Second Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Lake City, Georgia desire to ensure, by extending the time of operation to April 29, 2011, that the Second Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy will adequately protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Lake City;

WHEREAS, the Mayor, with the consent of the Lake City governing authority, has executed the Second Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy agreement adopting and extending the time for an additional period of five (5) years, or through April 29, 2011;

THEREFORE BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Governing Authority of Lake City, Georgia that the Mayor was, is, and shall be authorized to execute the extension of the Second Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy on behalf of the City in his discretion based on the health, safety and welfare of the citizenry of Lake City, Georgia.

THEREFORE BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ALSO RESOLVED by the Governing Authority of Lake City, Georgia that the mayor's execution of the Second Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy is hereby **RATIFIED** by the Governing Authority of Lake City.

WHEREAS, Clayton County and its municipalities must enter into an agreement for the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy in order to comply with House Bill 489 that was first adopted in 1997; and

WHEREAS, the development of the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy by the county and its municipalities should minimize inefficiencies resulting from duplication of services and competition between local governments and set forth a mechanism to resolve disputes over local government service delivery, funding equity and land use; and

WHEREAS, the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy should minimize non-compatible municipal and county land use plans and set forth a concise agreement that describes which local governments will provide which service within specified areas within a county and how the provision of these services will be funded; and

WHEREAS, the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy was first adopted in September 1999 and expired on April 28, 2000 whereupon it was renewed for an additional three years until April 28, 2003; and

WHEREAS, it is time to renew the current agreement on or before April 29, 2006; and

WHEREAS, specifics of the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy are currently being discussed; and

WHEREAS, when the negotiations have concluded and an agreement has been reached between the county and the cities in the county, the city manager will inform the mayor and council of the details during the last city council meeting in April; and

WHEREAS, Mayor of the City of Riverdale is hereby authorized to sign the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy on behalf of the City of Riverdale when all cities and the county have reached an agreement.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF RIVERDALE AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1.

The whereas clauses are hereby incorporated as true and correct as the findings of fact and conclusions.

Section 2.

Authorize the mayor of the City of Riverdale to sign the Clayton County Service Delivery Strategy after agreement has been reached between the county and the cities.

Section 3.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
