The project consists of replacing 1,852 linear feet of sewer main, extending existing sewer mains an additional 1,876 linear feet, and installing 1,960 linear feet of water mains. The project will benefit 155 persons, of whom 150 (97%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$573,979, with \$73,979 in match and leverage funds.
1762	Ambrose, City of Water Improvements	\$368,600	The Clty of Ambrose proposes to use \$368,600 in CDBG funds to construct water system improvements. The project consists of rehabilitating the 50-year old elevated water tank. The project will benefit 290 persons, of whom 206 (71%) are LMI. 1769	Argyle, City of Water Improvements	\$565,550	The City of Argyle proposes to use \$565,550 in CDBG funds for city-wide water system improvements. The project will consist of installing 6-inch mains to replace undersized 1.5-inch, 2-inch, and 4-inch water lines. The project will benefit 200 persons, of whom 178 (89%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$593,040, with \$27,490 in match and leverage funds.
1675	Ashburn, City of Water Improvements	\$237,639	The City of Ashburn proposes to use \$237,639 in CDBG funds for water system improvements. The project will replace 5,260 linear feet of undersized water lines with 6-inch PVC mains and install seven new hydrants. The project will benefit 116 persons, of whom 107 (92%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$270,835, with \$33,196 in match and leverage.
1676	Bainbridge, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$277,280	The City of Bainbridge proposes to use \$277,280 in CDBG funds for storm drainage improvements in the Wheat Avenue neighborhood. The project will replace undersized drainage pipes, improve catch basins and drop inlets, and add drainage infrastructure on Broughton Street. The project will benefit 65 persons, of whom 62 (95%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$388,529, with \$111,249 in match and leverage.
1776	Blackshear, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Blackshear proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to provide sewer improvements to residents in the southwest portion of the City. The project consists of rehabilitating the existing sewer pipes using the cured-in-place method and the rehabilitation of manholes throughout the target area. The project will benefit 183 persons, of whom 181 (99%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$566,875, with \$66,875 in match and leverage funds.



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1686	Blakely, City of Multi Activity Program	\$1,000,000	The City of Blakely proposes to use \$1,000,000 in CDBG funds for infrastructure and housing improvements in the North Avenue neighborhood. The project will replace sewer lines and laterals, make street and drainage improvements, reconstruct six homes, rehabilitate three homes, and clear six dilapidated structures. The project will serve 115 persons, of whom 110 (95%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$1,089,911, with \$89,911 in match and leverage.
1672	Brantley County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$666,231	Brantley County proposes to use \$666,231 in CDBG funds for street and drainage improvements for the Chicora Road neighborhood and the Blue Jay Road neighborhood. The project will benefit 231 person, of whom 176 (76%) are LMI. The project consists of paving approximately 3.5 miles of road and installing drainage ditches alongside the new roads. The total project cost is \$903,987, with \$237,756 in match and leverage.
1761	Broxton, City of Sewer Improvements	\$606,938	The City of Broxton proposes to use \$606,938.00 in CDBG funds for sewer system improvements. The project will consist of the rehabilitation of the City's existing wastewater treatment facilities. The improvements will benefit 1,347 persons, of whom 986 (73%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$684,140, with \$74,202 in match and leverage funds.
1693	Buena Vista, City of Water Improvements	\$490,000	The City of Buena Vista proposes to use \$490,000 in CDBG funds for improvements to the Water Treatment Plant. The project includes the replacement of the pumps at the Rogers Street well and the Old City Hall wells, which would include on-site treatment buildings. The project will benefit 2,173 persons, of whom 1,918 (86%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$510,500, with \$20,500 in match and leverage.
1713	Bulloch County Senior Center	\$750,000	Bulloch County proposes to use \$750,000 to assist with the construction of a new 6,200 square-foot senior activity center on County owned property in the City of Statesboro. The new center will replace the existing center located on Denmark Street. The project will benefit 124 persons, of whom 124 (100%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$951,346, with \$201,346 in match and leverage.
1722	Burke County Health Center	\$734,854	Burke County proposes to use \$734,854 in CDBG funds for the renovation of the Burke County Health Department. The project will benefit 401 persons, of whom 366 (91%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$776,365, with \$41,520 in match and leverage.



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1684	Butler, City of Sewer Improvements	\$705,419	The City of Butler proposes to use \$705,419 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements on Judge Street, Ridge Street, MLK Jr. Boulevard, Mason Lane, Georgia Road, Whitening Road, and Mockingbird. The project will benefit 145 persons, of whom 123 (84%) are LMI. The project will replace failing and undersized sewer lines with 8-inch PVC mains and replace failing manholes with 24 new manholes. 1753	Butts County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$659,787	Butts County proposes to use \$659,787 of CDBG funds for street and drainage improvements. The project consists of paving 0.93 miles of dirt roads and installing adequate drainage improvements. The project will benefit 52 persons, of whom 38 (73%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$788,026, with \$128,239 in match and leverage funds.
1680	Byron, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$750,000	The City of Byron proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for housing improvements on Dempsey Avenue, Boy Scout Road, Poole Street, and Poole Alley. The project will benefit 42 persons, of whom 40 (95%) are LMI. All rehabilitation and reconstruction activities will benefit 100% LMI persons. The project will rehabilitate nine homes, reconstruct five homes, and two units will be cleared. Total project cost is \$773,307, with \$23,307 in match and leverage.
1712	Cartersville, City of Water Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Cartersville proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds to replace aging and failing water lines within the ATCO Mill Village Phase I Target Area. The project will install approximately 7,700 linear feet of 8-inch water line and approximately 11 fire hydrants within the target area. The project will benefit 277 persons, of whom 237 (86%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$1,128,791, with \$628,791 in match and leverage funds.
1701	Cedartown, City of Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Cedartown proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements in the Goodyear Mill Village target area. The project will serve 222 persons, of whom 204 (92%) are LMI. The project will consist of replacing deteriorated sewer force main, collection lines, manholes, and providing new service laterals. The total project cost is \$1,013,220, with \$263,220 in match and leverage.
1749	Charlton County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$623,889	Charlton County proposes to use \$623,889 of CDBG funds to provide street paving and drainage improvements to Forest Lake Drive and Forest Lake Court. The project will benefit 54 persons, of whom 41 (75%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$693,679, with 69,790 in match and leverage funds.



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1707	Chattooga County Water Improvements	\$750,000	Chattooga County proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for water improvements along Mountain View Road. The project will consist of replacing existing asbestos-cement water lines, including all service laterals, connections, valves, and fire hydrants. The project will benefit 185 persons, of whom 146 (79%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$832,966, with \$82,966 in match and leverage.
1716	Chickamauga, City of Water Improvements	\$544,478	The City of Chickamauga proposes to use \$544,478 in CDBG funds for water system improvements in the Longwood/Park Street neighborhood. The project will consist of the installation of 5,650 linear feet of 6-inch PVC, 1,160 linear feet of 2-inch PVC, and two fire hydrants. The project will benefit 147 persons, of whom 124 (84%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$653,147, with \$108,669 in match and leverage.
1775	Coffee County Neighborhood Revitalization	\$498,925	Coffee County proposes to use \$498,925 in CDBG funds to implement Phase 2 of rehabilitation in the Oak Park neighborhood. The project consists of the rehabilitation of two owner-occupied deteriorated housing units, reconstruction of five owner-occupied dilapidated housing units, and the acquisition and clearance of six vacant, dilapidated units. The project will directly benefit 14 persons, of whom 100% are LMI. The total project cost is \$508,394, with \$9,469 in match and leverage funds.
1715	Colbert, City of Water Improvements	\$334,769	The City of Colbert proposes to use \$334,769 in CDBG funds for water system improvements in two separate target areas. Target area number 1 will benefit 79 persons, of whom 60 (75%) are LMI. Target area number 2 will benefit 36 persons, of whom 30 (83%) are LMI. The project consists of replacing old cast iron and asbestos-cement lines with new PVC water mains. The total project cost is \$371,969, with \$37,200 in match and leverage.
1743	Collins, City of Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Collins proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements. The project will consist of manhole rehabilitation; cleaning 8,825 linear feet of existing gravity sewer; 8,825 linear feet of Cured-in-Place rehabilitation for the existing 8-inch sewer; 6,225 linear feet of 4-inch PVC service laterals; and 83 sewer service connections. The project will benefit 178 persons, of whom 166 (93%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$838,841, with \$88,841 in match and leverage.
1669	Colquitt County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$533,858	Colquitt County proposes to use \$533,858 in CDBG funds for street and drainage improvements along Holly Lane and Foxthick Road. The project will benefit 102 persons, of whom 75 (73%) are LMI. The project consists of construction of a 20-foot wide asphalt paved road, installation of curb and gutter, installation of roadside ditches, new cross drainage piping, and erosion control measures. The total project cost is \$898,892, with \$365,034 in match and leverage.



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1780	Colquitt, City of Multi Activity Program	\$1,000,000	The City of Colquitt proposes to use \$1,000,000 in CDBG funds for sewer, flood and drainage, street improvements, and safety issues of residents living in dilapidated or substandard homes. The project will serve 129 people, of whom 127 (98%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$1,101,667, with \$101,667 in match and leverage funds.
1759	Cook County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$701,884	Cook County proposes to use \$701,884 in CDBG funds to provide street and drainage improvements along Chaserville Boulevard, Chaser Drive, Jo Treadway Road, and Indigo Lane. The project consists of 4,412 linear feet of paving and drainage improvements. This project will benefit 119 persons, of whom 103 (87%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$782,359, with \$80,475 in match and leverage funds.
1689	Cordele, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Cordele proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for drainage improvements in the Gillespie Selden Neighborhood. The project will benefit 187 persons, of whom 187 (100%) are LMI. The project consists of replacing the roadway ditches and deteriorated storm pipe system with properly sized storm sewer pipe and inlets. The total project cost is \$549,800, with \$49,800 in match and leverage.
1735	Cornelia, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Cornelia proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer and drainage improvements in the Old Cleveland Road and Wayside/Foster Street neighborhood. The project consists of installing 3,900 linear feet of 8-inch sanitary sewer, 2,700 linear feet of 10-inch sanitary sewer, 22 manholes, and 1,300 linear feet of 6-inch PVC service laterals. The project will benefit 475 persons, of whom 432 (91%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$3,032,987, with \$2,282,987 in match and leverage funds.
1671	Crisp County Water Improvements	\$243,891	Crisp County proposes to use \$243,891 in CDBG funds for water system improvements in the Willow Lake mobile home park. The project will consist of replacing 2,050 linear feet of water line and the installation of two fire hydrants. The project will benefit 51 persons, of whom 37 (72%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$294,843, with \$50,952 in match and leverage.
1696	Cusseta-Chattahoochee Neighborhood Revitalization	\$280,662	The Unified Government of Cusseta-Chatahoochee County proposes to use \$280,662 in CDBG funds to assist with neighborhood revitalization in the McNaughton Street neighborhood. The project will benefit 18 persons, of whom 18 (100%) are LMI. The project consists of the rehabilitation of five stick-built homes, reconstruction of one mobile housing unit (MHU), demolition of three dilapidated stick-built homes, and demolition of three MHUs. The total project cost is \$329,165, with \$48,503 in match and leverage.



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1703	Cuthbert, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Cuthbert proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for Phase II sewer improvements in a Target Area encompassing Hood, Seaboard, Birch and 4th Streets. The project will replace the Birch Street lift station, rehabilitate the existing sewer main with 3,900 linear feet of 8-inch cured-in-place sewer main, and rehabilitate manholes. The project will benefit 371 persons, of whom 346 (93.26%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$545,000, with \$45,000 in match and leverage.
1725	Danville, City of Water Improvements	\$468,500	The Town of Danville proposes using \$468,500 in CDBG funds for a city wide water infrastructure improvement project to benefit 106 families. The project includes replacing 2" water mains on Williams Road and Second Street/Atwell Road with 6" mains. The project will benefit 272 people, of whom 199 (73.2%) are LMI. The City has committed \$10,000 in match and leverage to support this project. Total project cost is \$478,500.
1670	Decatur County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$538,301	Decatur County proposes to use \$538,301 in CDBG funds for drainage and street improvements in the Bethel Heights Neighborhood. The project will pave approximately 1.16 miles of dirt roads and will install drainage piping with drop inlets. The project will benefit 108 persons, of whom 96 (89%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$816,775, with \$278,474 in match and leverage.
1750	Dexter, City of Sewer Improvements	\$420,700	The City of Dexter proposes to use \$420,700 in CDBG funds for rehabilitation of its wastewater treatment plant. The project will benefit 611 persons, of whom 491 (80%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$471,300, with \$50,600 in match and leverage funds.
1754	Dooling, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$630,094	The City of Dooling proposes to use \$630,094 in CDBG funds for neighborhood revitalization. The project will consist of the acquisition and clearance of four vacant/dilapidated housing units, rehabilitation of six housing units, and reconstruction of six housing units. The clearance project will benefit 96 persons, of whom 82 (85%) are LMI. The rehabilitation and reconstruction projects will benefit 100% LMI. Total project cost is \$641,770, with \$11,676 in match and leverage funds.
1764	Douglas, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$543,459	The City of Douglas proposes to use \$543,459 in CDBG funds for sanitary sewer and water system improvements. The project will consist of rehabilitating the 8-inch, 4-inch, and 6-inch sewer lines; replacing an existing 1-inch water line with an 8-inch PVC main, and the installation of four fire hydrants. The project will benefit 292 persons, of whom 273 (93%), are LMI. The total project cost is \$684,791, with \$141,332 in match and leverage funds.



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1683	Dublin, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$710,000	The City of Dublin proposes to use \$710,000 in CDBG funds for neighborhood revitalization on Flanders, Pritchett, Chester, Marcus, and Roberts Streets. The project will rehabilitate 13 housing units, reconstruct one housing unit, and acquire and clear three units. The project will benefit 139 persons, of whom 125 (90%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$763,577, with \$53,577 in match and leverage.
1736	Eastman, City of Water Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Eastman proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds to improve water distribution lines, fire protection and water quality within one low- to moderate-income Target Area. The scope of work will include over 15,000 linear feet of 6 and 4 inch PVC water lines, 11 replacement fire hydrants, and 11 new fire hydrants. The project will benefit 515 persons, of whom 381 (73%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$871,000, with \$121,000 in match and leverage funds.
1695	Ellaville, City of Water Improvements	\$319,717	The City of Ellaville proposes to use \$319,717 in CDBG Funds for water system improvements. The project will benefit 2,022 persons, of whom 1,597 (79%) are LMI. The project consists of replacing 6,200 linear feet of asbestos pipe with 6-inch PVC. The total project cost is \$340,217, with \$20,500 in match and leverage.
1710	Flovilla, City of Water Improvements	\$567,453	The City of Flovilla proposes to use \$567,453 in CDBG funds for water improvements in the Indian Springs Community. The project will install 7,800 linear feet of 6-inch PVC main (to replace an inadequate 1-inch main), plus service laterals, fire hydrants, and valves. The project will benefit 165 persons, of whom 160 (97%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$649,157, with \$81,704 in match and leverage.
1726	Forsyth, City of Water Improvements	\$412,181	The City of Forsyth proposes to use \$412,181 in CDBG funds for water improvements in a Target Area that encompasses Blount, Thomas, and Zellner Streets; Clearview Ave.; Freeman Rd.; and Brown, Phillips, and School Boy Lanes. The project will install 8,000 linear feet of 8-inch PVC main and 500 linear feet of 6-inch PVC (to replace current, smaller mains), new water meters, gate valves, and fire hydrants. The project will benefit 182 persons, of whom 142 (78%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$485,431, with \$73,250 in match and leverage.



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1718	Fort Valley, City of Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Fort Valley proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements for a Target Area that encompasses Carmen and Courtland Avenues, Boulevard, College, Neil, and South Montrose Streets, and Mimosa Drive. The project will install 4,400 linear feet of 8-inch main, 1,300 linear feet of 6-inch PVC force main, manholes, and related items. The project will benefit 452 persons, of whom 416 (92%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$850,000, with \$100,000 in match and leverage.
1677	Franklin, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Franklin proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for water and sewer improvements in the South River Road Target Area and Target Area 2, which includes 20 units of the Franklin Housing Authority and an apartment complex on Main Street. The project will include rehabilitation of 10,320 linear feet of sewer lines, installation of 1,100 linear feet of 6-inch water main and two fire hydrants. The project will benefit 330 persons, of whom 322 (98%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$985,000, with \$235,000 in match and leverage.
1682	Garden City, City of Water Improvements	\$360,360	The City of Garden City proposes to use \$360,360 in CDBG funds for water improvements in the Rossignol Hill Neighborhood. The project will replace water service lines to deliver adequate flow. The project will benefit 526 persons, of whom 480 (91%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$509,542, with \$149,182 in match and leverage.
1742	Glennville, City of Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Glennville proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements. The project will consist of the rehabilitation of 11,035 linear feet of 8-inch gravity sewer mains. The project will benefit 327 persons, of whom 302 (92%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$916,281, with \$166,281 in match and leverage.
1673	Grady County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$669,504	Grady County proposes to use \$669,504 in CDBG funds for street and drainage improvements in the Johnson Road Neighborhood. The project will install paving on 1.85 miles of dirt road as well as sloped side ditches, culverts, and cross drain stormwater pipes. The project will benefit 140 persons, of whom 127 (90.71%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$969,676, with \$300,172 in match and leverage.
1690	Griffin, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Griffin proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for water and sewer improvements for Phase II of the Meriwether Target Area. The project will replace galvanized and cast iron water mains with ductile iron pipe water mains, add fire hydrants, replace failing clay sewer mains (pipebursting method), replace sewer laterals, and related items. The project will benefit 95 persons, of whom 90 (95%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$1,250,185, with \$500,185 in match and leverage.



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1694	Habersham County Senior Center	\$750,000	Habersham County proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for public facility expansion of the Habersham Senior Center. The project will construct a new wellness center building to house a comprehensive wellness program, while also creating space in the main senior center building for the facility's other service offerings. The project will benefit 1,400 persons, of whom 1,400 (100%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$838,982, with \$88,982 in match and leverage.
1721	Hancock County Health Center	\$627,950	Hancock County proposes to use \$627,950 in CDBG funds for public facility improvements to renovate the existing Hancock County Health Department building located at 516 Boland Street. The project will include exterior improvements (Hardi-plank siding, water sealant, roof replacement, window and door replacement, etc.) and interior improvements (new HVAC, layout changes, handicap accessible restrooms, exam rooms, etc.). The project will benefit 185 persons, of whom 174 (94.05%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$727,950, with \$100,000 in match and leverage.
1773	Hoboken, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$738,811	The City of Hoboken proposes to use \$738,811 in CDBG funds to address substandard housing conditions throughout the city. The project will consist of the rehabilitation of five deteriorated housing units and the reconstruction of nine dilapidated housing units. This project will benefit 19 persons, of whom 100% are LMI. The total project cost is \$756,605, with \$17,794 in match and leverage funds.
1699	Hogansville, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$637,900	The City of Hogansville proposes to use \$637,900 in CDBG funds for water and sewer improvements in Target Area A (Blue Creek Ct., Blue Creek Rd., Lincoln St., Royal Ave., and Askew Ave.) and Target Area B (Askew Ave. and Lawrence St.). The project will install 8-inch PVC sewer main, rehabilitate and replace manholes, install cross-linked polyethylene tubing water main and valves, plus related items. The project will benefit 139 persons, of whom 124 (89.21%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$704,751, with \$66,851 in match and leverage.
1724	Irwinton, City of Drainage Improvements	\$545,600	The City of Irwinton proposes to use \$545,600 in CDBG funds for flood and drainage improvements in a Target Area encompassing Allen, Church, Glenn, Hughes, Knight, Payne, and West Main Streets. The project will install culverts, create new ditches, and regrade existing ditches. The project will benefit 96 persons, of whom 80 (83.3%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$573,000, with \$27,400 in match and leverage.



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1717	Ivey, City of Water Improvements	\$512,948	The City of Ivey is requesting \$512,948 in CDBG funds to replace 13,355 feet of water lines and install 15 fire hydrants on Bluffton Circle, County Club Road, Pamela Drive, Pine Bluff Drive, Pine Hill Way, and Rolling Hills Road. The current water system consists of 2" and 4" PVC lines which are outdated and failing. These pipes will be replaced with 6" PVC lines that can support new fire hydrants. The project will benefit 138 persons, of whom 99 (71.74%) are LMI. The City is contributing \$15,000 in match and leverage funds. Total project cost is \$527,948.
1688	Jasper County Senior Center	\$750,000	Jasper County proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for public facility improvements to the existing Senior Citizen Center located at 26 Mack Tillman Drive. The project will expand the Senior Citizen Center by 2,688 square feet (exercise room, ADA compliant restrooms, food storage, porch and more) and renovate existing space (ADA improvements to drop-off area, cabinetry, flooring, lighting, etc.). The project will benefit 144 persons, of whom 144 (100%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$949,278, with \$199,278 in match and leverage.
1729	Jefferson County Developmental Disability Center	\$724,280	Jefferson County is proposing to use \$724,280 in CDBG funds for public facility renovations to the existing Jefferson County Service Center, located at 1114 Clarks Mill Road, which serves developmentally disabled adults. The project will provide exterior and interior improvements. The project will benefit 42 persons, of whom 42 (100%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$754,280, with \$30,000 in match and leverage.
1714	Kingston, City of Water Improvements	\$267,000	The City of Kingston is requesting \$267,000 to replace 4,350 linear feet of 2-inch dead-end water lines serving Massingale Road. The replacement will be a 6-inch water main to alleviate long-standing issues of low pressure that constitute an ongoing public health hazard for the water customers.
