

REPORT ON PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

The Middle Georgia Regional Commission (MGRC), through the Regional Agenda process, is given the responsibility and authority to set achievement levels for local governments of the region. In doing so, MGRC recognizes that all local governments of the region are different and that some standards may be quite easily attainable for larger, well-funded governments, but more difficult to meet for other cities and counties. For this reason, MGRC has set Essential Standards, as well as Excellence Standards for the local governments of Middle Georgia. Essential Standards are differentiated from Excellence Standards, which may require increased planning, coordination, and financial commitment.

The Middle Georgia Regional Commission is dedicated to ensuring that every local government is able to meet all Essential (minimum) Standards of the Regional Agenda. Regional Commission staff will assist local governments with any tasks necessary to attain the Essential Standards at minimal or no cost. As of March 26, 2021, twenty-nine of the thirty-one local governments have achieved either the Essential or Excellence Standards. Throughout FY 2022, MGRC will provide technical assistance to the remaining three local governments to achieve the Essential Standard.

MGRC Assistance to Local Governments not Currently Meeting Essential Standards:

The 2017 changes to the Regional Planning Requirements (Rules and Regulations of the State of Georgia Chapter 110-12-6) eliminated penalties associated with communities that do not reach the Essential Standards set forth in the Regional Plan. However, MGRC still recognizes a responsibility to assist local governments however possible in the attainment of these standards. MGRC is currently undertaking the following activities to assist local governments in the attainment of the Essential Standards:

- MGRC staff transmits regular messages to all local governments that are delinquent on Department of Community Affairs (DCA) reports, including the Report of Local Government Finance (RLGF) and Government Management Indicators (GOMI) survey. MGRC also serves as a liaison between local communities and the DCA Office of Research and Surveys, as necessary.
- MGRC has offered website development services to the City of Ivey.

GUEST SPEAKER

Laura Mathis reported that in 2017, the State of Georgia received a grant from the Department of Defense, Office of Economic Adjustment (OEA) for assistance to military communities on a statewide level. Among the proposed projects was a regional planning process in each community with a major military installation. Throughout 2018 and 2019, Middle Georgia participated in a Charette and Regional Planning Initiative, which provided several recommendations for next-action steps. With the remaining available funding from OEA, the State of Georgia, through the Department of Economic Development, Center of Innovation for Aerospace, contracted with the Middle Georgia Regional Commission (MGRC) in December 2019 for project management of a phase II regional planning and implementation initiative.

In August 2020, Middle Georgia Regional Commission contracted with Future iQ to conduct an innovation gap analysis and ecosystem development project for the region. Tasks included mapping the existing framework of innovative capacity within the region, conducting a

performance and gap analysis of the region's strengths and opportunities, and establishing working groups of local stakeholders to promote the development of an innovation ecosystem within the region.

2. Public Hearing on 2021 Regional Plan Annual Implementation Report

Greg Boike reported that as of October 1, 2017, the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) updated the rules pertaining to Regional Planning Requirements (Rules and Regulations of the State of Georgia Chapter 110-12-6). The updated rules are designed to provide a helpful framework for the preparation and implementation of regional plans. Previously, Regional Commissions were required to complete a full update to the work program contained within their regional plan on an annual basis. The updated rules have replaced this requirement with an annual Report of Accomplishments related to the regional work program and update local governments based on the performance standards outlined in the current regional plan.

- New downtown plans or redevelopment plans for Macon-Bibb County, Jones County, cities of Forsyth, Hawkinsville, and Perry.
- Assisted Putnam County with updates to land use and zoning regulations.
- Four communities received 2020 CDBG awards and five received 2021 LWCF grant awards.
- Collaboration with Middle Georgia Consortium to jointly fund a CGTC position for Workforce Development Career Services.
- Significant progress on Robins AFB solar project in coordination with CGJDA.

Council Vice Chairman John Harley asked for any comments or questions on the Regional Plan Annual Implementation Report. There were none, and Council Vice Chairman John Harley called the public hearing to a close. The comment period on the Regional Plan documents ends March 26, then the draft will be submitted to DCA and the final document will be presented at a future Council meeting for approval.

GOOD OF THE ORDER

a. DRI #3244

Greg Boike reported that since the last MGRC Council meeting, the regional review process was completed for DRI #3244, Sardis Church Road Truck Stop, located in Macon-Bibb County. MGRC received two comments anticipating impacts from the project. The Macon Water Authority commented that a sewer line extension would be required. The Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) provided comments on the need to coordinate timing and phasing needs of intersection signalization, as well as the need for additional information on the final plans and permit applications.

b. Executive Director's Report

Laura Mathis presented the Executive Director's report with updates since the February meeting.

Ms. Mathis reported that there may be interest from some of the counties in the region to initiate the TSPLOST process. She noted that several counties have a single county TSPLOST in place or

up for consideration. In order to initiate the regional TSPLOST process, a majority of the counties could need to pass a resolution.

Prior to the meeting, Ms. Mathis sent out information on the Georgia Rental Assistance Program that provides relief to individuals, families, and landlords whose finances have been negatively impacted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. More information can be found at www.georgiarentalassistance.ga.gov.

Ms. Mathis gave an update on the following topics discussed at the General Assembly.

Behavioral Health Case Management Pilot Proposal

The MGRC was asked to participate in an expansion of case management services for individuals who have behavioral health issues and are at risk of eviction. It would also be an opportunity to partner with RiverEdge Behavioral Health. The program would be funded through the Department of Community Affairs. If the General Assembly does not appropriate the funds, the program will not be offered in Middle Georgia.

 County transfer from Georgia Mountains Regional Commission to Atlanta Regional Commission (HR 130)

Ms. Mathis reported that Forsyth County went through the petition process to be transferred from one Regional Commission to another. This would be the first time since the legislation was put in place in 2009. This process identified amendments that are needed to the new rules and regulations for this process. The Georgia Department of Community Affairs plans to release the draft rules soon.

Rural Development Council (HR 185)

Ms. Mathis reported that the House Rural Development Council was reauthorized for two years to continue to work on rural issues.

Ms. Mathis reported that the MGRC has launched the program mentioned at the last meeting where the Middle Georgia Regional Commission was asked to assist in registering individuals for vaccine appointments, arranging transportation for vaccine appointments, and coordinating mobile vaccination events across the region.

The MGRC issued two requests for proposals for the financial audit, due March 17, and for Workforce services that is due March 19.

The Pension Committee consists of members of the Council and two MGRC staff. The staff members are elected by MGRC staff; Tiffany Andrews and Howard Scott were selected as the employee representatives.

<u>ANNOUNCEMENTS</u>

Shavonda Hill reported that GMA will host the Cities Connect Call on March 16 to discuss the American Rescue Plan Act that will provide general information and guidelines included in the bill.

The next MGRC Council meeting will be on April 8, 2021, via Zoom.
