REENTRY PARTNERSHIP HOUSING

Beginning in January 2018, current RPH placements will reflect the following changes listed in blue:

 \$600.00 per month for up to three (3) months for each placed offender who is released from confinement to DCS supervision. The offender may be eligible for an additional three (3) months of housing if:

ordered to <u>treatment</u> (and the provider is an active recovery residence in THOR, GARR, or CARF)

OR

• mandated to participate in a <u>Day Reporting Center</u>.

The length of housing eligibility beyond the 3-month period will be determined/approved by DCS housing staff in conjunction with the respective community supervision officer, chief supervision officer, or Parole Board member or designee.

 \$675.00 per month for <u>up to six (6) months</u> for each placed offender who is released from confinement to DCS supervision and who is placed in a RPH personal care home, RPH nursing home or is designated as a <u>GDC Mental Health Level III</u> at the time of placement. The length of housing eligibility beyond the initial 4-month period will be determined/approved by DCS housing staff in conjunction with the respective community supervision officer, chief supervision officer, or Parole Board member or designee.

Accountability Court Participants who are eligible on or after January <u>1, 2018:</u>

Active participants of the following courts can be eligible for up to 6 months of housing assistance under RPH when court criteria for homelessness has been met and the participant has been deemed eligible by court coordinators through their financial assessment process:

- Felony Drug Court
 - \$600 per month
- Mental Health Court
 - \$675 per month
- Family Treatment Court
 - \$600 per month
- Veterans Court
 - \$600 per month

OR

 \$675 per month if the participant also has a Mental Health SPMI diagnosis which has resulted in placement in a RPH personal care home, RPH nursing home, or other appropriate RPH facility approved for GDC MH level 3 residents.

The length of housing beyond the initial 3-month period will be determined/approved by DCS housing staff in conjunction with the respective supervision officer, accountability court coordinator, and/or judge.
